

We're proud to announce competition opportunities available for students in our Newton County area and other counties within our servicing area - Pass this on to your kids, grandkids and great-grands! The theme for the 2020-2021 contest is: "Drug Abuse – No Excuse." All entries must be submitted by January 31, 2021. ESSAY CONTEST

The contest is open to all 6^{th} , 7^{th} , & 8^{th} grade students.

Participants must write their essay themselves, but they may get help from teachers, parents, or friends in the form of ideas.

Length: No longer than 250 words. **Paper size**: $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ inch.

Text: Typed, computer generated text, hand written or hand printed.

Judging based on: Closeness to theme, neatness, correct grammar, originality. Each entry must have the following information on the back of the essay: Student's full name, school, location, grade, Elks lodge name, and must also be accompanied by Hold Harmless agreement.

POSTER CONTEST

The contest is open to all 3^{rd} , 4^{th} , & 5^{th} grade students.

Poster paper: Ideally, posters should be submitted on $8\frac{1}{2}$ x 11 inch paper. **Judging based on:** Closeness to theme, neatness, originality, correct grammar, and originality. Copyrighted characters are prohibited. Entries containing copyrighted material will be disqualified.

Each entry must have the following information on the back of the poster: Student's full name, school, location, grade, Elks lodge name, and must also be accompanied by Hold Harmless agreement.

VIDEO CONTEST

The contest is open to 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th grade high school students.

Rules: Participants may be an individual or group, video must be 2 to 5 minutes in length and submitted on flash drive or similar readable format.

Judging based on: Closeness to theme, neatness, originality, age and language appropriate, positive message, and quality of video.

Each entry must include the following information: Student or Group's full name, School, location, grade, Elks lodge name, must also be accompanied by Hold Harmless agreement, and if minors an additional release form is required.

FROM THE GRAND LODGE



PEARL HARBOR CAMPAIGN OFFICIALLY EXTENDED

At the 2019 Elks National Convention in St. Louis, outgoing Grand Exalted Ruler Mike Luhr issued a challenge to the Elks members to raise funds for the Pearl Harbor National Memorial in Hawaii.

"I ask you then, will your Lodges and Members support the idea of making sure the memories of our veterans, passed and living, are kept with us for the years to come, and make sure the history of that 'Day in Infamy' is recorded so our great-great-grandchildren will be able to see where our country has been?"

Since that announcement, Elks have been partnering with the Pacific Historical Parks, a WWII focused 501(c)(3) tax-exempt public benefit organization that oversees the Pearl Harbor National Memorial, to help preserve, restore and modernize the USS Arizona Memorial. **As of August 31, we've raised \$397,957.42!** This means we've met 2 big goals already.

- The first \$15,000 Elks raised will be used to replace old, faded and peeling outdoor exhibits along Pearl Harbor National Memorial's perimeter.
- An additional \$270,000 raised by Elks will upgrade current static displays with digital exhibits, build new interactive displays to engage children, and modernize the museum.
- All additional funds raised will be used to enhance and expand a virtual education program that will allow youth and adults across the country to "virtually visit" Pearl Harbor and learn about our history.

Thanks to all who have donated so far! These contributions will help honor the service and dedication of Americans whose profound contributions to our nation should never be forgotten so that generations to come will know and appreciate the enormous sacrifices of the Greatest Generation.

We know COVID-19 put a wrench in many plans, including the conclusion of this project, previously planned for the Grand Lodge Convention. So, we've officially extended the end of this program to November 11. Will you help us reach our goal of \$1 per member? Make a donation today at <u>enf.elks.org/phc</u>

"As the COVID-19 pandemic has taken over our lives, it has also taken over the financial stability of many of our Lodges within the Order of Elks. After discussions with various Grand Lodge officials, the following action was recommended and approved by the Board of Grand Trustees:

It is the recommendation of the Board of Grand Trustees that Grand Lodge provide to each Local Lodge of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America a monetary one-time grant in the amount of \$1,500 for Lodge COVID-19 financial relief."
