

Participants must write their essay themselves, but they may get help from teachers, parents, or friends in the form of ideas.

Length: No longer than 250 words. **Paper size**: $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ inch.

Text: Typed, computer generated text, hand written or hand printed.

Judging will be based on the following: Closeness to the theme, neatness, correct grammar, and originality.

Each entry must have the following information on the back of the essay: Student's full name, School, location, grade, Elks lodge name, and must also be accompanied by Hold Harmless agreement.

Deadline: All entries must be submitted by January 31, 202

Winners: Covington Elks Lodge will select the top essays, using the criteria listed above. The lodge will notify winners. Winning essays will be forwarded to District Competition. District winners will be forwarded to State Level Competition. All winning entries become the sole property of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, and may not be returned.

National recognition: Each State Drug Awareness Chairman will choose one overall winner. This winning essay will be submitted for entry into the National contest and may be featured on the www.elkskidszone.org website and/or in ENF or DAP publications. District Deputy (DD) Clinic held at the Lodge last month on August 15th. Thanks to all who came out!



15 MEMBERSHIP RECRUITMENT IDEAS

- 1. **Produce a Lodge flyer** and hand them out to non-members during community events, display in local offices, restaurants, etc.
- **2. Open your Lodge to community organizations** that need a place to meet. (*ie: local supports group, clubs, senior groups, etc.*
- 3. Ask to be invited into a local school; parents and teachers are the prospects. Sponsor a presentation and hand out drug awareness information during lunch or an assembly. Inform the school about the Elks' youth programs and student scholarships.
- **4. Develop a training program** for those in your Lodge who are usually a first point of contact for prospects and educate them about our mission. (*ie: bar staff, greeters, officers*)
- 5. Provide calling cards for members to hand out.
- 6. Plan activities at the Lodge which will attract target groups.

 (ie: retirement planning, housing/loan seminar, guest speakers such as local city officials, doctors, and school superintendents)
- 7. Target Stray Elks.
- **8. Open your Lodge to scouting** and other youth organizations.
- 9. Give every member a Lodge decal for their car.
- **10. Develop a culture** in the Lodge in which Gen X and Y are wanted and welcome. Let them join purely for social reasons and they will build an age group base that will develop into something more.
- 11. Schedule a Member Appreciation Day in April, May or June.
- 12. Legacy Recruitment Drive.
- 13. Give guests Lodge pins and make them feel wELKome!
- **14. New Members** should be our biggest recruiters. Give them each 3 applications and ask them to submit 3 prospects to the membership chair and receive the award GER pin.



BEACON GRANT CHANGES FOR 2020-2021 YEAR

On August 1, Beacon Grants will become available to every Lodge in the amount of \$3,500—a 40 percent increase over last year's grant amount. Typically, Beacon Grants must be used for active projects. But, since nothing is what it was, we've built in flexibility for Lodges to meet pressing needs in their own backyards. Here's how we are relaxing Beacon Grant guidelines.



Keep on keepin' on. If the Lodge can continue its regular Beacon Grant project with safety precautions, fantastic.

Nope, not safe. If an active Elks-led project isn't feasible, donations will be considered to the partner organization the Lodge usually works with, or to an organization providing COVID relief.

Change it up. If a Lodge would like to pause its regular Beacon Grant project to do a COVID relief project, we're all for it.

Split it up. From the beginning, the Beacon Grant has only been allowed for one annual project. This year, it can be split between up to two projects.

Merge it. With just the click of a button on the Grants Dashboard, the Lodge can

opt to merge their Spotlight Grant with their Beacon Grant, making a total of \$5,500 available for a Beacon Grant project.

We announced way back in the pre-pandemic days of late February that the Beacon Grants were set to be \$3,000 for FY2021. However, by suspending both Promise Grants and new Impact Grants, we can offer Beacon Grants at \$3,500. With the increased grant amount and built-in flexibility, we're confident that Lodges will continue to rise to the occasion and help communities where it's needed most.



ALL-AMERICAN LODGE

Elkdom's All-American Lodge Award – the most coveted of Grand Lodge awards – demonstrates membership involvement. Competition is based on District, State and Grand Lodge levels. Points are earned by competing Lodges, based upon participation in 44 categories, including sponsoring a new Lodge, posting a gain in membership and participation in Grand Lodge contests and programs, such as the Elks National Foundation, Hoop Shoot, Grand Exalted Ruler Awards and Youth Scholarship programs. Final entries are judged by the Grand Lodge Fraternal Committee.

Entrants must submit a form that will be mailed to Lodges with the November Grand Lodge Newsletter and is to be completed and sent to the District Deputy by April 1, 2021. (NOTE: State Association contest due date may differ.) Look for details in the Grand Lodge Newsletter in January.

The District Deputy will select winners by membership division for the district. These are then submitted to the State Association Lodge Activities (or Fraternal) Committee Chairman by April 15, 2021. (The designated State Chairman will review entries, sign and submit them to the Grand Lodge Fraternal Committee Member for the All-American Lodge Contest by April 30, 2021.)
